Face Coverings are Mandatory in Churches

There is an exemption for those who are officiating at services and presiding at Holy Communion, and those who assist them (for instance by reading, preaching, or leading prayers) who do not always need to wear a face covering, although one should be worn if physical distancing cannot be maintained (such as at the distribution of Holy Communion).

In line with government advice, children under 11 and people with disabilities or certain health conditions are also exempt from wearing face coverings.

Please do not come into church if you think you may have symptoms of Covid 19.

Farewell Service for Bishop Colin 16th September 2020

I don't know how many people joined in the farewell service for Bishop Colin on Wednesday evening, but there were at least 65 devices on Zoom so guite possibly double that - not a bad attendance for the Vale and Abingdon Deaneries.

In his address Bishop Colin apologized for the changes which had inevitably been made to his plans for saying goodbye to us all, not least his inability to provide prosecco and chocolate cake in Dorchester Abbey on 4th October, though that service will be live streamed.

He made a point of thanking everyone who had made his time as Bishop such a joy: Churchwardens,

PCC members, administrators, Deanery reps, bellringers, choirs and organists, youth leaders,

LLMs. AMs - even the cleray!

Bishop Colin mentioned his record in blessing loos. kitchens and coffee areas and his appreciation for the way our churches model hospitality. He also expressed his thanks for the way in which the whole body of Christ has come together in community to help during the pandemic to reflect God's love in a way which has been variously contemplative, compassionate and

courageous according to need.

Above all, quoting from Philippians, he promised "to thank my God every time I remember you" and to pray for us as he continues to drive through our parishes. And we, Bishop Colin, will pray for you. Your successor will have a hard act to follow!
