### Stir up Sunday

Sunday 22nd November, apart from being the feast of Christ the King and the last Sunday before Advent, is also known as "Stir up Sunday." This is partly from the Book of Common Prayer Collect for the day

"Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people; that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may of thee be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen"



But also because it was the traditional day for making Christmas puddings in order to give them time to mature before Christmas. Maybe one of the good things to come out of lockdown will be having the time for those traditional preparations, rather than having to cram everything into the last days or minutes (depending on how organized you are) before the shops close on Christmas Eve. Or even, I have to confess, sometimes buying them at the reduced price on Boxing Day!

Everyone is telling us that Christmas will be different this year, but different doesn't always mean worse. Different can be rediscovering some of those old traditions as well as starting new ones for our families. Watching Granny make the pudding over Zoom perhaps? Other sites are available, but they do seem to have cornered the market don't they? Perhaps, like hoover and biro, it will become one of those generic terms for an activity, whichever platform we use?

Something as simple as weighing, measuring and stirring our cakes and puddings might be just the thing we need to give us time to think, or remember, or daydream, or pray. Slowing us down in contrast to many things which might be stirring us up rather than our puddings. And if we save the pudding till the next time we're together, rather than having it on Christmas Day, that might be a lovely new tradition, too.
