An Order for Night Prayer (Compline)

For use during Lent

The ancient office of Compline derives its name from a Latin word meaning 'completion' (completorium); it is a service of quietness and reflection before rest at the end of the day. Parts of the service are said, others sung; please say or sing the words in **bold** type. Please sit or stand as you feel comfortable.

Preparation

The Lord almighty grant us a quiet night and a perfect end. **Amen.**
