that we may do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with you, our God. Amen.

May God who loved the world so much that he sent his Son to be our Saviour, forgive us our sins and make us holy to serve him in the world through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Prayers of Intercession

The response to "Lord, in your mercy," is **Hear our prayer**

Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called children of God. We meet in the name of Christ and share his peace. The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you

We normally exchange the peace with one another, for example by shaking hands

There is a short time for silent prayer as the altar is prepared for Communion

The Eucharistic Prayer (G)

The Lord be with you and also with you

Lift up your hearts

We lift them to the Lord

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God It is right to give thanks and praise

Blessed are you, Lord God our light and our salvation to you be glory and praise for ever

From the beginning you have created all things and all your works echo the silent music of your praise In the fullness of time you made us in your image the crown of all creation

You give us breath and speech, that with angels and archangels and all the powers of heaven we may find a voice to sing your praise:

Holy, holy, holy Lord
God of power and might
heaven and earth are full of your glory
Hosanna in the highest
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord
Hosanna in the highest

How wonderful the work of your hands, O Lord As a mother tenderly gathers her children you embraced a people as your own When they turned away and rebelled your love remained steadfast

From them you raised up Jesus our Saviour, born of Mary to be the living bread in whom all our hungers are satisfied He offered his life for sinners and with a love stronger than death he opened wide his arms on the cross.

On the night before he died he came to supper with his friends and, taking bread, he gave you thanks He broke it and gave it to them, saying Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you do this in remembrance of me

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine he gave you thanks, and said Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me

Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.
