Lockdown update

As I mentioned last week, we met with the churchwardens on Wednesday (by Zoom, of course) to discuss the plans for restarting public worship.

You can see from this week's list of services that we are beginning with a number of outdoor services to mark Mothering Sunday on 6th and 14th March.

There will be a small number of services in some churches on 21st March and an outdoor service in St Andrew's churchyard for Palm Sunday.

Then, on Easter Day, we hope to be able to have services in five of our seven churches.

Thereafter, we intend to continue offering some services in church each week; this should gradually increase in line with church and government guidance and local infection rates – though if the events of the last year have taught us anything, it is that nothing is set in stone. We will always be guided by the need to keep people safe so don't throw away the masks and hand sanitiser just yet. Meanwhile, our online services will also continue, though we hope to be able to livestream from more of the churches.
