Dear friends, Easter has arrived! Alleluia, Christ is Risen. He is Risen indeed, Alleluia!

Easter speaks of liberation and freedom. Just as the Hebrew people celebrated Passover as their freedom from slavery in Egypt, so Easter speaks to all of us of our freedom from sin and death.

It is more than a year since we first went into Lockdown in the face of the coronavirus pandemic which has gripped the entire world. Now, by adhering to the restrictions imposed upon us, and with the roll out of vaccines, freedoms are beginning to be restored. The pandemic has been a reminder to us of the need for salvation from an invisible, but real, and universal agency, Covid 19. The vaccines mean that we can live our normal lives once again.

Jesus's life, death, and rising again, is God's answer to the universal condition of sin and death which prevents us from enjoying life in all its fulness. Through God's loving action in Jesus, we can be truly *fully* alive. On Holy Saturday, Easter Eve, Jesus has been locked away, restricted within the tomb, but at Easter he breaks out with the power of resurrection life. As we emerge from our lockdown spaces, we can do so in the strength and joy of Jesus resurrection life. We can discover new ways of loving and serving others, new ways of living our lives to the full. If this does not warrant an Alleluia! I do not know what would.
