Rev'd Frank Parkinson RIP



The much-loved and hugely respected Rev'd Frank Parkinson passed away last weekend after suffering a stroke. His wife, Janice and his two sons were at his bedside.

Priest, soldier, PTSD counsellor, author, lecturer, and family man: Frank Parkinson was a man of many parts. Born and brought up in the North-East, he was fiercely loyal to his northern roots. Indeed, he began his ministry as a curate in Sunderland in the 60s but soon decided that his calling was to be a Chaplain in the Armed Forces. He served in the British Army for 25 years, retiring as an Assistant Chaplain General in 1992. It was during his time in the Forces that he trained as a counsellor with Relate and began to specialise in tackling post-traumatic stress. His empathetic nature and his innate ability to listen, rather than just speak, made him a natural and effective counsellor.

After retiring from the Army, Frank and Janice moved to Longcot, where they have lived ever since. In retirement Frank continued with his studies into PTSD. His experience in counselling people with trauma had led him to realise that there were few reference books on the subject that were written by practising counsellors. He was determined to rectify this and went on to write several influential books and a number of articles on PTSD. These were highly regarded, not just by those in the medical profession, but ordinary people who found them both accessible and practical. He was a frequent lecturer at universities across the UK and was a relaxed and humorous orator.

Although he loved the academic and practical challenges that unravelling PTSD presented, he continued to contribute fully to our Benefice. He was an active member of the Ministry Team and a regular leader of worship in St Mary's Church in Longcot, as well as in other churches in the area.

Words can hardly describe the esteem with which Frank was held within our community. He will be sorely missed, not least for his wisdom, empathetic nature, impish sense of humour and lively personality. Our thoughts and prayers are with Janice and their two sons, Ben and Jeremy.
