Welcome

Welcome to Lucas Timothy Robert Heneage and Arlo Freddie Courtney, who were baptised in St Mary's Church Longcot on Sunday 5th January.

An Unusual Font

When Lucas Heneage was baptised in Longcot Church last Sunday the family brought along a ship's bell to be used as the font. This particular bell was once aboard the British Battleship HMS King George V which saw action against the Bismarck and was present at the surrender of the Japanese in World War Two.

There is an old Royal Navy tradition in which the children of those serving on board may be baptised in the ship's bell. Lucas' mother Victoria explained that her grandfather had served on the ship and that her aunt had been the last child to be baptised in the bell. When the bell was disposed of, the family's application to acquire the bell was successful and a new family tradition of using it for baptisms began.
